Language Arts / Reading

Students experience literature in the form of nonfiction, fiction, poetry, folktales and plays. Reading comprehension and fluency develops and improves as students are presented with the following skills:

- Using word identification strategies
- Linking spoken and written language
- Using structural analysis
- Using context clues
- Comprehending the main idea
- Sequencing events
- Analyzing details

Second grade students use writing to convey meaning. Students will:

- Write effectively using words and pictures to convey thoughts
- Write multiple sequential sentences on a given topic
- Apply spelling and phonetic patterns
- Apply grammar and mechanics of writing


MOTOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT

Our Physical Education program enhances both large and small muscle development, balance, hand-eye and foot-eye coordination.

The fundamental development of skills for both team and individual sports is the emphasis for 2nd grade students.

MUSIC

Our music program emphasizes reading basic music, vocal rendition and appreciation of various genres and artists.











Instruction includes hands-on activities to develop concepts. The students are introduced to the following areas of study:

Social Studies

Students will focus on:

- *Applying the skills of historical analysis and interpretation
- *Understand and explain the development of significant leaders, events, and factors in Illinois history from the Native Americans through modern times
- *Discuss significant leaders, events and factors in U.S. history from the period of exploration through 1945. (1946- present; second semester)
- *Understands and can explain the basic principles of a democratic government
- *Relationships between geographic factors and society
- *Being able to understand and explain the premises of economic activity and social justice
- *Understanding that scarcity requires choices by consumers and producers

Science

Hands on and interactive science will help students develop the process of scientific inquiry including the areas of:

- *Living things and how they function, adapt, change and interact with each other and the environment
- *Know and classify animals that are mammals, birds, fish, reptiles, amphibians, insects and spiders.
- *Discuss extinction and variations on current age images.
- *Processes of the earth and its resources
- *Composition of the universe and Earth's place in it
